NCCA RULES & PROCEDURE FOR NATIONAL CAMPDRAFT CHAMPIONSHIP UPDATED 10 AUGUST, 2020

- To be run at an NCCA Affiliated Campdraft Association's large event, to be three rounds over 3 days and hosted at a location agreed to by the NCCA annually.
- Entry to NCCA Championship to be by invitation of the Top 5 ranked competitors available from all Association, at the conclusion of the most recently concluded complete year of competition. If a rider from the top 5 is unavailable, then the next highest ranked available competitor will be eligible.
- Each association will invite the Winner of their Champion Lady Rider event, if not
 available the next Lady Rider in line will be invited. If the leading Lady Rider has
 already qualified as an Open Rider then the next placed Lady Rider will be invited to
 attend.
- Each association team will then consist of 6 riders.
- Each Rider will be eligible for individual awards during the competition and contribute to their team's total points score.
- In the event a Rider qualifies in more than one Association they must nominate the Association they will be representing.
- Competitors will ride a horse of their own choice; however once competition commences, no substitute horse or rider will be allowed (as per NCCA Rules).
- Associations: ACA; ABCRA; SCA; and GCA
- The overall highest aggregate score after the Three Rounds would be the winner of the title of 'NCCA National Champion Rider' for the year.
- No nomination Fee.
- Sponsor's assist with prize money.
- Round Money to be discussed.
- NCCA supports with a Trophy/Buckles.
- Judging: Two judges will judge the event under NCCA rules with their scores being averaged. Judges will be selected by the NCCA.
- Maiden horses can be entered. However, as they are competing against open horses, if they were to win their status would automatically become OPEN
- There will be an overall highest Team after the 3 rounds with monies won donated to a charity of their choice.
